





Russia, India turn to Gujarat to help increase trade turnover





Russia and India have reiterated their commitment to strengthen trade and economic partnership to reenergize the business relationship between the two countries that has been very slow to take off. The issue was discussed as a matter of high priority during the meeting of Russia-India Business Forum on the sidelines of 8th edition of <u>Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit</u>, in <u>Gandhinagar</u>, from <u>January 9 to 13</u>. At the forum, the two sides exchanged opinions on their joint experience and considered the prospects of cooperation, including regional cooperation, in trade.

Russian Deputy Prime Minister Dmitry Rogozin, the point-man for Russia-India cooperation, led the 60-member government and business delegation to the summit, where Russia showcased its impressive industrial achievements, with a huge potential of investments in India.

The Russian delegation also included high-level officials from Tatarstan and Astrakhan regions, which have already established strong economic partnership with Gujarat for decades. Astrakhan, in particular, presented opportunities of its Lotus special economic zone (SEZ) to the Indian business leaders.

Over a dozen Russian companies and organizations represented Russia at the summit: Among them, the Emergency Situations Ministry, Sibur, Novatek, Rosneft, Roscosmos, Rosatom, Rostech, Schwabe and Russian Helicopters company. This was the largest-ever participation of business companies and organizations from Russia since the first Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit. This also showed the great importance Moscow gave to the business summit, especially in relations to the trade and economic cooperation between Russian regions and Indian states.

Modi-Rogozin talks

On the eve of the inauguration of the summit, Rogozin met with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and discussed different issues of bilateral economic partnership in the mutual interest of "special, privileged" strategic partnership.

Coupled with China's range of economic initiatives intertwined with their OBOR and globalization strategy and the coupling of China initiated financial mechanisms towards integration of regional economies, China sits in a prime position of influence, power and patronage.

China lauds Modi's 'positive' remarks on ties



Beijing, Jan 18 (IANS): China on Wednesday hailed Prime Minister Narendra Modi for being optimistic about Sino-Indian ties.

 $Beijing \ also \ said \ the \ common \ interests \ of \ both \ the \ nations \ outweighed \ their \ differences.$

In a press briefing, Foreign Ministry spokesperson Hua Chunying said ties with India were important to Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa (BRICS) and developing countries.

"China applauds Modi's positive comments. Chinese and Indian leaders have a common understanding that our shared interests far outweigh our differences," Hua was quoted as saying by Xinhua news agency.

The comments come a day after Prime Minister Narendra Modi called the rise of India and China an "unprecedented opportunity" for the two countries and the world.

Responding to Modi's view that it was "not unnatural" for two large neighbouring powers to have some differences, Hua said China is committed to increasing trust, expanding cooperation and properly resolving any differences with India.

The development of China-India relations is important to the strength of the BRICS and as a tool to promote world multipolarisation, Hua said.

Consequences of surgical strikes to be severe



Apparently reacting strongly to the statement recently made by the Indian Army Chief to carry out surgical strikes within Pakistan, Defense Minister Khawaja Asif Monday gave a befitting reply warning India of the severe consequences of the move.

In a fiery speech during the Senate session, Asif said "If India conducts a surgical strike such a response would be given that the country would not even dream of it."

India claimed carrying surgical strikes but these were not real. If India tried to make any effort to carry out surgical strikes in future these will be responded with full force and they will forget to carry out even fake strikes, said the defense minister.

Khawaja Asif said Pakistan will continue political, diplomatic and moral support to the Kashmiris in their just struggle for right to self-determination.

The Minister said the India is making failed attempts to link the Kashmir freedom movement with cross border infiltration and terrorism. He said India's this campaign has failed at the diplomatic fronts.

Khawaja Asif said India is also afraid of Pakistan's success in fight against terrorism. He said Pakistan's success has been recognized by the world and world bodies. He said the valiant armed forces of the country have successfully eliminated the terrorists and their sanctuaries from the country.

He said that India carried out 330 ceasefire violations including 290 violations on Line of Control and 40 on the Working Boundaries till December last. He said 45 civilians were martyred and 138 injured in these violations. He said the frequency of the violations have been reduced after December. The Defence Minister said the violations were effectively responded by the armed forces of the country. He said these violations were reported to United Nations Military Observer Group at the Line of Control and Working Boundaries to appraise the UN for investigations. He said the Ministry of Foreign Affairs also raised the issue at the diplomatic and bilateral levels.
